### Principal's Report, Tristan C.

January-March: Scope and Sequence: Black Excellence Day, Lunar New Year, Ramadan, Black History Month, Pink Shirt Day, this is a time where we are honouring different voices. Term 2 Reporting and Spring Break in March.

## Enrollment update

There has been no change in enrollment, but there is more 'fluidity' where students are coming and going from the school community. We have had 19 students transition out of the school and 20 join the community this year. At this point we expect that registration and enrollment should be similar in numbers for next year; however increased shifts in and out of the school may indicate a later start to assigned classes in the Fall.

#### Sentiments from the Administration Team

January and February is a time where the Principals and Vice Principals are able to engage in the school in different ways and spend time outside of the office. The focus rests in Curriculum and Instruction. There is also time allocated towards New Teacher Evaluations. Behavioural challenges have slowed with the start of the new year, which allows for time to be spent connecting in different ways. The Lunch Monitors are active in K-3 Classes with training and activities for the volunteers in the Leadership roles.

#### How can parents help?

This is a season where further supports to lean in are needed, there is new material being presented, and assessments may reflect a student's grappling with new ideas and new learning.

Grade 7 Parents please regularly review the School District and Secondary School websites for dates and offerings. Dorothy Lynas will send an email tomorrow (January 14) with a short summary of options for transitioning to Grade 8 and out of the Dorothy Lynas Community, but we do not send updates unless directed by our colleagues. Grade 7 parents are to manage the opportunities and processes for their child.

## School Planning

The school planning document has been updated and will be posted soon.

-Shift our scope and plan into the Language of a "Journey" with your children. Executive Functioning is going to have a shift where staff will take into account developmental differences and neurodiversity. The shift in the scope in response to parent and teacher feedback. Staff will approach the School Goals at the February Collaboration early dismissal (Feb 26 early dismissal, 2pm-3:30pm). Classroom Teachers will be the leads in communicating. An appreciation to parents and community members for their feedback thus far.

### Literacy:

Looking at the data at Dorothy Lynas, in areas like mark distribution in the classroom, but also across the District with regards to Literacy Skills. The data being used is from the Learning Updates (MyEd) and some FSA Data. The Grade 4 & 7 FSA will be going home on January 29<sup>th</sup>. The focus is to expand and provide more data in Literacy to invoke more data-driven dialogue (example, meeting on January 10 with District Principal of Curriculum Instruction Assessment, Jeeniece Chand). We are engaging staff with where we are, in response to this data, and what our areas of focus are. We have had a change in staffing with French Immersion Literacy; however the resources that were purchased by the PAC will stay in the school.

#### Cheakamus Centre

We now know that there will not be an overnight for the Grade 3 student to Cheakmus Centre, there is an overnight for the Grade 4-5.

#### Treasurers Report, Kelly C.

We are on track with the spending this year. The budget is balanced and up to date.

#### Grade 7 Graduation, Kelly C.

Grade 7 Grad fundraisers have been going well. The Grade 7 Parents Group will be meeting shortly, and a thank-you to Dorothy Lynas for the support. Tristan C. extends a thank-you to the organizers of the Winter Market that was exceptional.

## Funds Allocation (New Requests for PAC Funds)

-School staff and admin asked about whether PAC would be open to receiving funding requests from school staff and admin throughout the school year or only during the annual

budgeting process. PAC replied that it is open to receiving requests at any time. Funds can be reallocated or specific fundraising can be initiated to meet the need if voted on.

School staff and admin asked if the PAC prefers to allocate funds to funding requests that benefit all students or if PAC was open to other requests. EDI is the goal, so requests that support a EDI and/or a larger scope of children is the focus for any new requests. -PAC Budgets run at different times than the school does (Sept – April), but PAC is open to requests being submitted at different points of the year. Preference was indicated towards requests being presented in person from staff at the PAC Meetings; more information with regards to process to come.

-A Request from Tristan C. for the PAC to have a Purchasing Card rather than have the School purchase for the PAC; however this prevents the GST Savings which is a spending concern for PAC.
